San Francisco Bay Area Rapid Transit (BART) rail service connects the San Francisco Peninsula with Oakland, Berkeley, Berryessa, Walnut Creek, Dublin/Pleasanton, and other cities in the East Bay, as well as San Francisco International Airport (SFO) and Oakland International Airport (OAK).

CLIPPER CARD

Clipper is a "smart card" with stored value that can be used on various Bay Area transit operators. Clipper cards can be purchased at fare machines in all BART stations—there is a one-time \$3.00 fee for the card. A minimum value is required to enter the system, so it is best to load fare on your card before entering.

Keep your Clipper card to use on most transit in the Bay Area and for future trips. Each passenger must have their own card.

Visit www.clippercard.com to learn how to apply for cards with discounts for Seniors (age 65 and up), Youths (age 5-18), persons with disabilities, or to add a BART High Value Discount (stored as a separate "purse" on the card).

BART PAPER TICKETS

BART is phasing out tickets in 2020. There is an extra \$.50 per trip surcharge to use a BART ticket instead of a Clipper card. Once phased out, customers will not be able to purchase tickets at our stations or online. Tickets will still be accepted at fare gates, but you will only be able to add value to your ticket if it's needed to exit the system.

BART EXCURSION FARE

BART's Excursion Fare allows you to tour the BART system for up to three hours on a \$6.20 fare, if you enter and exit at the same station. To avoid being charged the excursion fare if you enter the system and need to leave before riding a train, see a Station Agent.

For Train	Transfer
Amsoch	Take Daily City train, then transfer to Richmond train at Bay Fair Station, then transfer at 19th St./Oakland Station.
Millbrae	Take Daily City train, then transfer at Balboa Park Station. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> When trains with direct service from Balboa Park Station to Millbrae are running, take Millbrae train. When trains with direct service from Balboa Park Station to Millbrae are not running, take SFO/Millbrae train and transfer at San Francisco International Airport Station to Millbrae shuttle train.
OAK Int'l Airport	Take Daily City train, then transfer at Coliseum Station.
Richmond	Take Daily City train, then transfer at Bay Fair Station.
SFO Int'l Airport	Take Daily City train, then transfer at Balboa Park Station to SFO/Millbrae train.
Berryessa/ North San José	Take Daily City train, then transfer at Bay Fair Station.
Sundays	
For Train	Transfer
Amsoch	Take Daily City or Montgomery train, then transfer to Richmond train at Bay Fair Station, then transfer at 19th St./Oakland Station.
Daly City	On those Sundays when trains with direct service to Daly City are not operating, take Montgomery train and transfer at Montgomery St. Station to SFO/Millbrae train.
Millbrae	Take Daily City train to Balboa Park Station, or Montgomery train to Montgomery St. Station. There, transfer to SFO/Millbrae train, and at San Francisco International Airport, transfer to Millbrae shuttle train.
OAK Int'l Airport	Take Daily City or Montgomery train and transfer at Coliseum Station.
Richmond	Take Daily City or Montgomery train and transfer at Bay Fair Station.
SFO Int'l Airport	Take Daily City train to Balboa Park Station, or Montgomery train to Montgomery St. Station. There, transfer to SFO/Millbrae train.
Berryessa/ North San José	Take Daily City or Montgomery train and transfer at Bay Fair Station.

Sunday schedules vary; on some Sundays, Daily City trains will not operate and Montgomery trains will operate instead. Check before you go: up-to-date schedules are available on www.bart.gov and the official BART app.



Amtrak Thruway bus service is a system of intercity coaches, locally-contracted transit buses, through-ticketed local bus routes, and taxi services that provides passengers of Amtrak's rail service with connecting trips to regional destinations.

Fare Information

Amtrak tickets are purchased for the length of each passenger's journey. Amtrak California Thruway bus tickets are sold only as part of your rail trip. Connections are timed for convenient transfers between services.
