EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

This report provides recommendations for the 2016 Federal and State Legislative Advocacy Programs.

BACKGROUND/RATIONALE:

Based on the Board's discussion on December 9, 2015, staff has revised the 2016 Federal and State Legislative Advocacy Programs. The additional language proposed can be found in attachments 1 and 2 and are italicized.

Each year, the AC Transit Board of Directors adopts advocacy programs to provide guidance for the District's activities in Washington, D.C. and Sacramento to influence transit legislation, appropriations, and administrative matters at the State and Federal levels. The attached programs for 2016 address on-going efforts as well as emerging issues for the coming year.

Staff solicited input to develop the attached Federal and State advocacy programs from key staff and executives. Per the Board's direction, draft programs were distributed to advocacy groups and the District's planning and funding partners to solicit feedback. Responses received were considered in developing the attached advocacy programs.
